With two contrasting movements that reflect vigneties of fall, this piece will delight players and audiences. Flowing melodies and colorful harmonies give way to a rollicking jig and evoke the beauty, color, and excitement of harvest time.

"Falling Leaves," with its flowing melodies and colorful harmonies, reminds us of the beauty in the colorful leaves that gently fall to the ground. Violins carry much of the melodic material but cellos and violas also contribute some levely lyrical moments.

Folk Pestival" celebrates the joy of bringing in the autumn harvest. It's a rollicking "Jig"-style movement set in 6/8 time. The general tonality is Dorian mode, which adds to its folk quality. As in the first movement, cellos and violas get a chance to play some lyrical melodies. The whole ensemble plays a rhythmically interesting pizzicato section before closing out the movement with a variation on one of the opening "jig" themes.

Autumn Scenes was premiered in Pacific Palisades, CA by the Paul Revere Middle School Advanced Chamber Strings combined with the St. Matthew's Chamber Orchestra Strings at a fall concert in 2013. The composer conducted this performance that brought together a wonderful group of middle school children and talented professionals.
